The challenge

'Collaborative Action for Control of Cancer and Other Non-Communicable Diseases among Mumbai Police' set out to screen the entire Mumbai Police force and their immediate family members — nearly 70,000 people — for diabetes, obesity and hypertension, and for oral, breast and cervical cancers, with all screenings in camps across police stations and staff quarters.

What we did

DWI was instrumental in building the high-security Android application powering the programme: screening workflows for police staff and their kith and kin, camp operations, and a central healthcare committee view.

First-level data validation and approvals sit with hospital senior staff before data joins the larger research pool; live dashboards serve the Trusts' operations and business office.

- HIPAA, ICD-10 and HL7 compliance with high-security design
- Interfaces with Nagpada Hospital and government beneficiary offices
- Extensive reporting with real-time field-level data

With 600+ team members and health workers using the app daily, multi-partner analysis time was drastically reduced — turning a city-scale screening programme into a continuously visible operation.
